- Exit **MAP Cafe (#4)** facing **Rathburn Hall (#28)**.
- Make left onto the path/lot in between **Harbison Chapel (#2)** and **MAP**.
- Make another left onto the sidewalk that runs parallel to **MAP**.
- Cut through the Quad using the center sidewalk.
- Walk through the arch on the other side of the Quad in between **Crawford Hall (#1)** and **Ketler Hall (#19)**.
- Cross Campus Drive to **Memorial Hall (#20)**.
- Enter **Memorial Hall** where the #20 appears on the map.
- Just inside the entrance, cross the hall, and enter the double doors, **#27**.
- Make a left and enter the first door on the left, **Room #113**.
