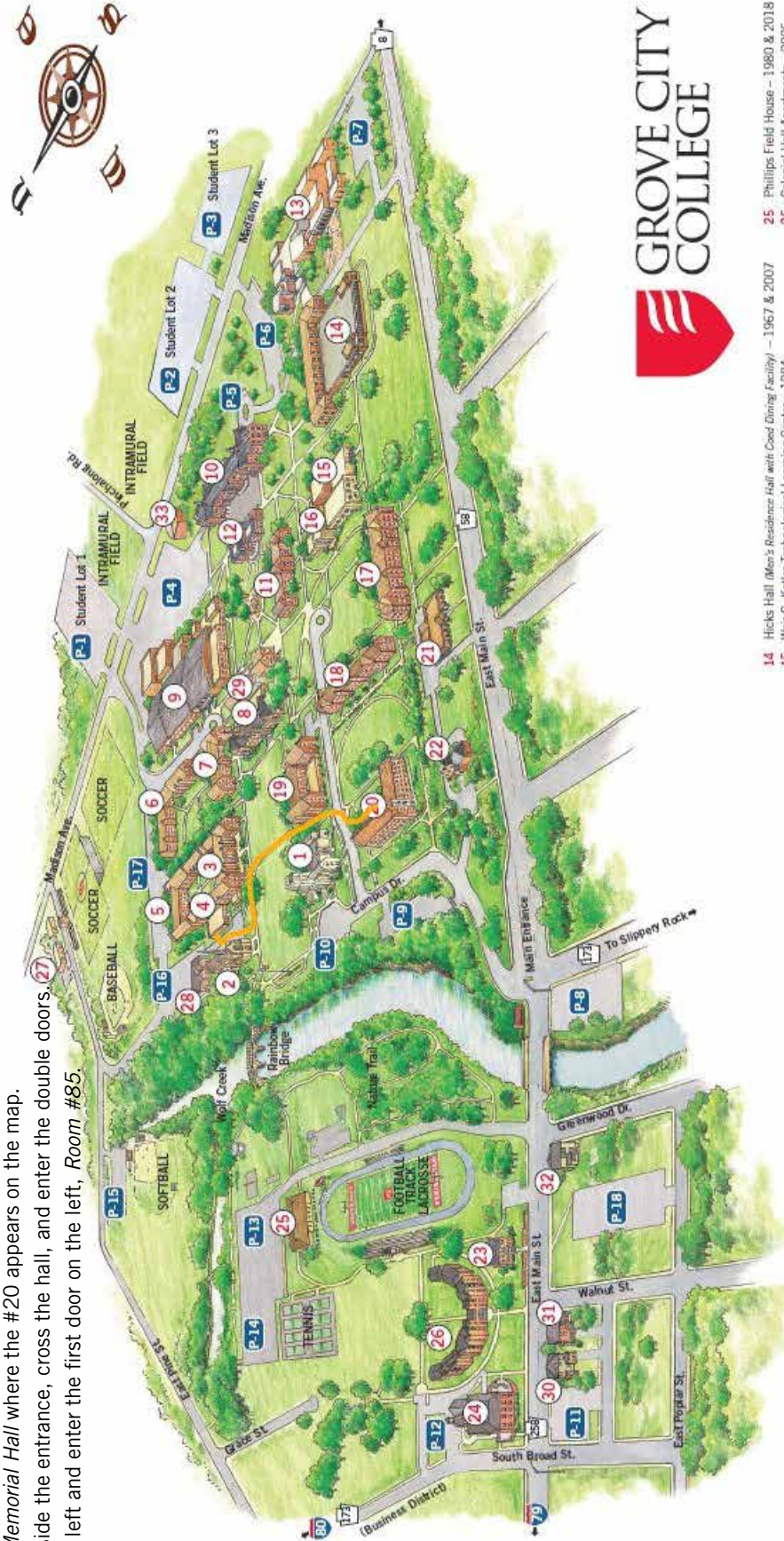

## Walking Directions to Memorial Hall:

- Exit *MAP Cafe* (#4) facing *Rathburn Hall* (#28).
- Make left onto the path/lot in between *Harbison Chapel* (#2) and *MAP*.
- Make another left onto the sidewalk that runs parallel to *MAP*.
- Cut through the Quad using the center sidewalk.
- Walk through the arch on the other side of the Quad in between *Crawford Hall* (#1) and *Ketter Hall* (#19).
- Cross *Campus Drive* to *Memorial Hall* (#20).
- Enter *Memorial Hall* where the #20 appears on the map.
- Just inside the entrance, cross the hall, and enter the double doors. (#27)
- Make a left and enter the first door on the left, *Room #85*.
